## Economic Development Grant FY 2017

## **Background:**

The *Economic Development Grant* was authorized in the amount of \$150,000 by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Adopted Budget. This grant is in its first year of funding and is currently a 1-year funding cycle.

## **Purpose:**

The purpose of the grant is to provide economic and workforce development services to supplement and support the work of the Urban County Government. Funding this cycle will impact workforce areas of:

1) Training/retraining; 2) Employment entry/re-entry.

## **Programming information:**
