Artworks provides a variety of leisure education classes where people of all ages and abilities can learn and create in a fun and nurturing space.

Classes begin the week of September 16 and are available for both fall and spring sessions. Registration opens August 21 at noon.

Pottery

Beginning/Intermediate Pottery*

Tuesdays, 10 a.m.-12:30 p.m. | ages 16 & up | \$160 per session

Session 1: September 17 – November 19 (229000–01)

Session 2: February 4 – April 8 (429000–01)

A daytime class for all levels including beginning instruction and guidance for more experienced students. Beginners will learn the basics of hand building, including pinch pots, coil and slab construction. Instruction on the wheel will occur once students become familiar with the properties of clay construction.

Beginning Hand Building*

Tuesdays, 6-8:30 p.m. | ages 16 & up | \$160 per session

Session 1: September 17 – November 19 (229000–02)

Session 2: February 4 - April 8 (429000-02)

Learn the fundamentals of working with clay through hand building techniques. Students will learn to hand build items such as pinch pots, bowls, mugs and boxes in addition to glazing and surface decoration. Wheel throwing will also be introduced.

Intermediate Pottery*

Refine your technique and achieve new goals. This class will review the basics, then incorporate advanced work such as making lidded vessels, pulled handles, and assembling separate components.

Open Studio is for the hobby potter who has the skills to work independently. This is not a class and does not include instruction. Participants register for the Wednesday or Saturday option and may use the studio during the other class times to work as needed and with instructor approval. However the students registered for that class get first priority on the wheels.

Make it with "Mud" Youth Pottery*

In this six week course students will be introduced to basic building techniques through pinch pots, slab construction, and coiling. As skills develop, students will transition to more advanced forming and decoration techniques.

Study classical Japanese Karatedo in a traditional, non–competitive atmosphere. Students build their self–confidence, physical fitness, and mental focus through the study of this martial art. Participants learn basic hand and foot techniques, forms and partner drills. As students progress, more advanced techniques are introduced along with increased understanding of their application. Karatedo rank and colored belts are awarded to students who successfully demonstrate skill levels appropriate for advancement.

Bluegrass Céilí Academy - Irish Dance

Irish céilí (pronounced kay-lee) dancing is the native group dancing of Ireland and is danced to traditional Irish music such as reels and jigs. Learn generations-old dances handed down through the years in addition to original choreography. Instructed by Megan Moloney.

Kiddie Kapers Dance Program

Dance classes are for youth ranging in age from 2–15. All classes are organized by age and experience as a guide for ability levels. Classes are offered at two locations, Artworks and the Tates Creek Recreation Center, Monday–Thursday. Kiddie Kapers classes meet once per week, on the same day and time slot for a total of 22 weeks from September–May. Classes culminate in the fall with a holiday show and in the spring with a recital at the Lexington Opera House.

How much? One 22–week class is \$220 (recital costume included.) Partial scholarships are available.

The following classes are offered:

- Tiny Dancers, Preschool, Beginning and Intermediate dance classes are a mixture of tap, jazz and ballet.
- Jazz/Hip Hop Dance classes consist of an upbeat fusion of dance including hip hop and dance team music and movements.
- Ballet includes the basics of ballet dance with barre work, floor and dance combinations.
- Acro is a style of dance that combines jazz and hip hop dance techniques with acrobatic elements.
