Symposium On Youth Gun Violence Brings City Together:

Last week, One Lexington hosted its second annual "Symposium on Youth & Young Adult Gun Violence". Over 130 community partners attended this 1-day event that featured an address from Mayor Linda Gorton, national speakers, workshops focused on the long-term work of addressing community gun violence, presentations from One Lexington Violence Prevention Grant winners, and awards given to individuals who are "game changers" in our community. This was also a great networking opportunity where different organizations and individuals could connect and begin the process of building some new partnerships. This year's symposium was focused on the root causes of gun violence and featured professional development opportunities and breakout sessions centered on systemic inequalities (Tiffany Brown), educational disparities (Dr. Roger Cleveland), mental health access and stigmas in communities of color (Dr. Shaun Andrews), and substance use disorder (Carmen Marks). We also talked about the impact social media and music is playing when it comes to youth conflicts. This served as a great space to continue building solidarity and synergy with partners in the city's violence prevention ecosystem.

While interpersonal violence affects all genders, the power dynamics and societal response often lead to more severe & fatal outcomes for women who are victims of domestic violence. <u>It Takes A Village In-School Mentoring Program Kicks Off:</u>

Last week we kicked off our #ItTakesAVillage in-school mentoring groups. ONE Lexington, The Voyage Movement, and Walker Reconstruction will be facilitating 30 weekly groups in 20 different schools across the Fayette County Public Schools district, including alternative schools like MLK, The Learning Center, Audrey Grievous Center, and Success Academy. Many of the 400-plus students we will be engaging each week have been affected by high-level trauma, are system-involved, or living in single-parent households. This collective has been successful in the last couple of years in creating some alternative pathways for these boys and girls. In serving them each week we will also have the opportunity to provide wrap-around services for their families as requested.






Walk A Mile In Our Shoes:
